
#### Important things for this year:

  - Orienteering
  - Fire building
  - Basic knots
  - Patrol method

#### Sleds

There is no exact sled design that will be required, only a few specifications.

# Klondike 2022 Patrol Needs

It is essential for all patrol sleds to contain each of the following items to fairly compete in the events, and to be prepared for the winter weather and whatever may come up during Klondike.

- 1. **Patrol Sleds:** Sled must follow basic construction guidelines, but may then contain whatever you want to add to them. Just remember whatever you add, you carry with you all day. Have fun, it's your sled!
- 2. Sleds must have on them the following gear, stored in a container or pack, quickly accessible:

Pens or Pencils

Paper

Scouts BSA Handbook

Watch or device to keep time

Orienteering Compass

At least 50' of cord or rope

Patrol Flag

First Aid Kit

Shelter material

Protection for hypothermia victim

Camp Map

Fire building materials

Water for each patrol member

Daypacks

As suitable snow is not guaranteed, patrols should have the flexibility and preparedness to be able to carry all the above equipment in either their sleds, or in daypacks. Ideally they will pack all equipment into the daypacks and pack the daypacks onto the sleds. (School backpacks work fine for daypacks)

#### 3. Scouts must have:

Proper Winter Clothing

Gloves

Head Covering

Boots or other winter foot gear (NO tennis shoes)

Water Bottle
